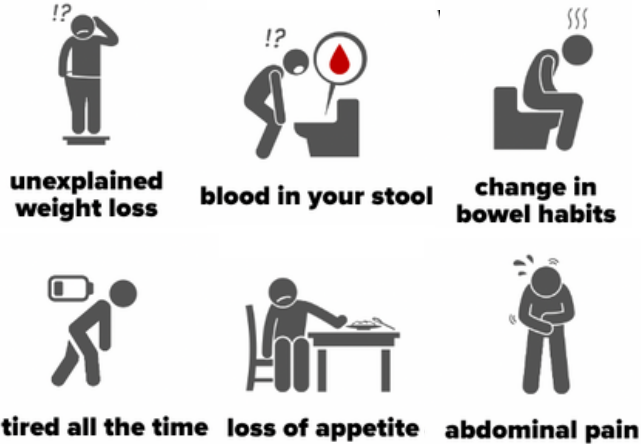


# Colorectal Cancer: What You Need to Know

## Risk Factors



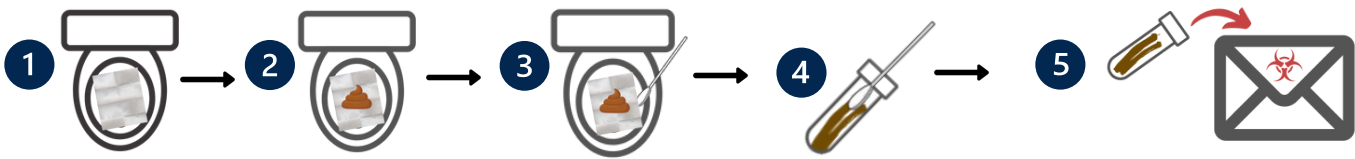
## CRC Screening Types:

### Stool DNA Testing

**When:** every 3 years  
**Where:** at home

### Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT)

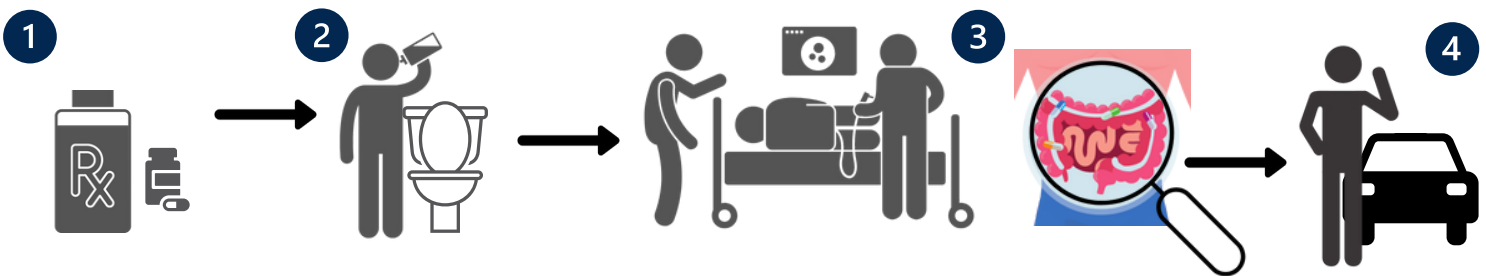
**When:** every 1 year  
**Where:** at home



### Colonoscopy

**When:** every 10 years  
**Where:** doctor's office

**Who should get screened?**  
All adults ages 45-75 years.
