1.	Complete the Standard Program Application.	
2.	Submit a Personal Statement addressing questions and upload to DICAS by deadline.	
3.	Answer and upload the new UC Davis Medical Center DI Program Addendum Questions and upload them to DICAS in the "Dietetic Internship Program Designation" section by deadline. Type your name in the upper right-hand corner of each page. Link each answer to 300 words, single spaced, 11pt font, at https://health.ucdavis.edu/dieteticinternship/	
4.	Send Official Transcripts to DICAS at: DICAS Transmittal Dept., P.O. Box 9118, Waterman, MA 02471	
5.	Upload a DPD Verification Statement or Declaration of Intent.	
6.	Upload your CV/Resume into DICAS by the deadline.	
7.	Upload an official DPD course list from your DPD program advisor by the DICAS Deadline. This is an official list (or copy of an official list) of courses required to meet Dietetic Program in Dietetics requirements at your college/university.	
8.	Enter in your completed coursework into DICAS and ensure your completed coursework selected categories align with the categories listed by your DPD Program (i.e., DPD Science vs DPD Professional). Note: If you have transfer coursework or coursework from outside the United States, be sure to enter the relevant classes into DICAS and categorize accordingly (i.e., DPD Science vs DPD Professional).	
9.	Enter the names and contact information of each of your references for 3 Letters of Recommendation. UC Davis Medical Center Dietetic Internship requires at least one letter from a work or volunteer supervisor and at least one letter from an academic reference (professor, academic advisor). The third letter can be either a supervisor or academic reference.	
10.	Pay DICAS Fees Application Payment for UC Davis Medical Center Dietetic Internship Program (Must be postmarked January 6, 2025 to be considered)	
1.	Complete the UC Davis Medical Center DI Program Supplemental Application document	
2.	Enclose \$50.00 Application Fee - payable to "UC Regents"	
3.	OPTIONAL: Enclose a Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope (SASE) - Please write "Application Involvement" on back of the postcard. Upon processing your supplemental application, the UCDMC DI program will sign and return any SASE included in your application packet. This is the preferred and most accurate method to ensure your supplemental application is received. USPS return receipt is not necessary and has the potential to be an inaccurate assurance.	
4.	Place all Supplemental Application packet items inside an envelope.

1. Academics

- Minimum DPD GPA 3.0
- Demonstrate good performance in upper division nutrition and science courses:
 - Advanced nutrition, medical nutrition therapy, nutrition and the lifecycle
 - Biochemistry, anatomy and physiology
- Recency: Completion of DPD academic coursework or graduate degree in nutrition within 3 years of start date

2. Essay Questions

- **DICAS Personal Statement**
 - Address all components of the questions
 - Include specific examples
 - 1000 words or less
- **UCDMC Addendum Questions**
 - Upload to DICAS
 - 2 questions, 300 words or less
- **Highlight your skills and suitability for the program**
 - Handling situation with minimal direction
 - Working with diverse groups
 - Opportunity to market yourself!

3. Letters of Recommendation

Three letters of recommendation (via DICAS)

UCDMC Requirement

One letter from academic reference: professor or academic advisor

One letter from work or volunteer supervisor

Third letter can be either supervisor OR academic reference

4. Work and Volunteer Experience

- Nutrition or foodservice-related experience is a plus
 - Exposure to a hospital setting is beneficial
- For non-nutrition related experiences, think about transferable skills
- Paid or unpaid internships, or practicum class-based experiences
- Involvement in student nutrition associations/clubs
- Responsibility, time management, problem solving, ability to work with others, leadership

5. Extracurricular Activities

Demonstrate your individual strengths

- Leadership
- Teamwork, collaboration with others
- Time management skills
- Problem solving skills

6. Interviews

- Video-based interview with top candidates
 - WebEx or Zoom
 - 25 minutes
- Scheduled in late February
- Professional, effective communication, ability to verbalize critical thinking and problem-solving skills

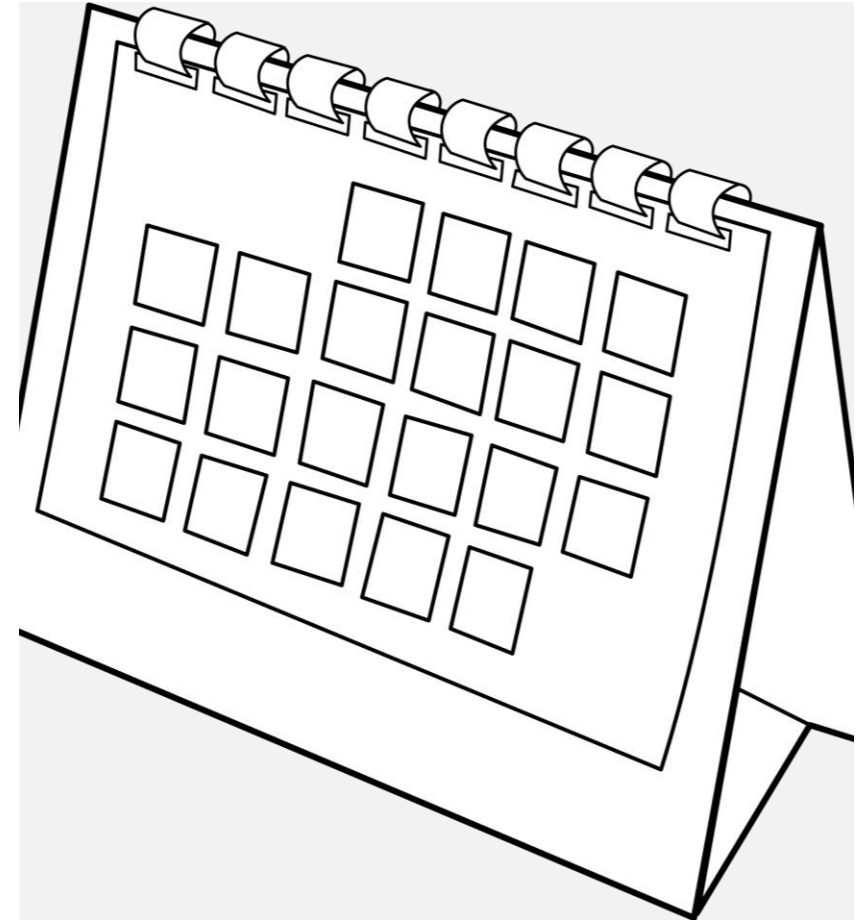

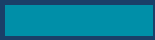

Ambulatory Nutrition

- 4 weeks planned, up to 7 with elective.
- Adults and pediatrics
- Nutrition counseling and education
- Tailoring nutrition therapy for:
 - Learning needs
 - Health literacy
 - Readiness to change
 - Diverse regional community

Community Nutrition

- 2-5 weeks
 - 2 weeks at WIC (Women, Infant, Children)
 - 3-week elective option at DaVita Dialysis
- Nutrition education – individual and group
- Develop education materials and lesson plans





Other Learning Activities

- Staff Relief: Minimum of 2 Weeks (Up to 6 weeks)
 - Gain independence
 - Reinforce entry-level practice
- Electives: 3 to 6 weeks (dependent on preceptor availability)
- Didactic Classes
 - 10% of internship program hours
- Clinical case study
 - Written and oral presentation on a patient focusing on the nutrition related care and literature related to their care.
- Journal club
 - Intern critical evaluation of nutrition-related research and how applies to clinical practice with facilitated discussion led by the intern
- Clinical Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) Project (~20 supervised practice hours)

2025-2026 Internship Class

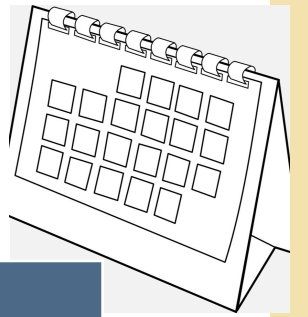
- Class Size: 6 interns
- Program Start and Length: **September 15, 2025 to July 3, 2026** (42 weeks)
- Arrival to Sacramento 3 weeks before start date: **August 25, 2025**

- Full-time, 40+ hours per week*
- Daily schedule varies by preceptor/rotation*
- Additional time required outside of workday*

- Interns cover ~7-12 weekend/holiday shifts
- 2-week Winter Break and 1-week Spring Break
- +Some UC holidays

**For these reasons it is strongly encouraged that you avoid outside employment or enrolling in a graduate degree program while participating in internship*
