Subject to conditions prescribed by UC Davis Health, Facilities Planning & Development Division, responses to Prequalification Questionnaires for a lump sum contract are sought from prospective California current and active "B" licensed General Contractors (GCs) for the following project:

Project Description:

- Phase 1 - Replace the existing mammography equipment in Room 0509 with new GE Pristina Senographe equipment. Equipment installation, setup, and commissioning will be performed by the vendor. Install a patient lighting experience system. The patient lighting experience system will be procured by the Owner and installed by the Contractor.
- Phase 2 - Replace the existing mammography equipment in Room 0511 with new Siemens Mammography B. Brilliant equipment. Equipment installation, setup, and commissioning will be performed by the vendor.
- Concurrent Work (Phases 1 & 2): Refresh both rooms with new paint, flooring, and lighting as required. Perform compliance upgrades to patient and staff restrooms and patient dressing rooms.

Please review the prequalification requirements carefully before completing the Prequalification Questionnaire. The University seeks General Contractors that meet all criteria requirements included in the Questionnaire (Prequalification Step 1). Prospective bidders that meet all criteria on the Prequalification Questionnaire will be invited to participate in Prequalification Step 2 – Interviews. A document outlining interview scoring criteria will be distributed to prospective bidders that pass Step 1 of the prequalification process.

Prequalification questionnaires will not be accepted after the due date and time. No supplemental data or additional project information will be accepted after due date and time unless specifically requested by the University. Only prequalified contractors will be invited to participate in the bidding process for the above project once construction documents are advertised. Following the submittal of bids, a contract will be awarded to lowest responsible prequalified bidder.

University reserves the right to reject any or all responses to this notice, to waive non-material irregularities, and to deem general contractors prequalified to submit proposals for the project. All information submitted for prequalification evaluation will be considered official information acquired in confidence, and the University will maintain its confidentiality to the extent permitted by law.

Every effort will be made to ensure that all persons have equal access to contracts and other business opportunities with the University within the limits imposed by law or University policy. Each Bidder may be required to show evidence of its equal employment opportunity policy. The successful Bidder and its subcontractors will be required to follow the nondiscrimination requirements set forth in the Bidding Documents and to pay prevailing wages at the location of the work.

In addition, the University is committed to promoting and increasing participation of small business enterprises (SBEs) and disabled veteran business enterprises (DVBES) relating to all goods and services covered under the awarded agreement, subject to any and all applicable obligations under state and federal law, and University policies. The

awarded contractor shall make best efforts to provide qualified SBEs and DVBEs with the maximum opportunity to participate.

The work described in the contract is public work subject to section 1771 of the California Labor Code.

No contractor or subcontractor, regardless of tier, may be listed on a Bid for, or engage in the performance of, any portion of this project, unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 and 1771.1. This project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.

The successful Bidder shall pay all people providing construction services and/or any labor on site, including any University location, no less than the highest of: UC Fair Wage; California Minimum Wage; and Local Minimum Wage; and shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local working condition requirements.
