### Pioneering nurse anesthesia education

The Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing at UC Davis welcomed the first students in the University of California system to pursue a Doctor of Nursing Practice — Nurse Anesthesia (DNP-NA) degree.

This accredited program is only the sixth of its kind in California and addresses a critical workforce need for highly skilled anesthesia providers. These future nurse anesthetists will combine advanced clinical expertise with leadership training to improve patient care across diverse settings.

## RESEARCH BRIEFS

### Professor launches new global gerontechnology center

Professor Roschelle Fritz announced a new center aimed at helping older adults live independently using technology. She published [“A Global Gerontechnology Center for Nursing Science for improving aging-in-place technologies”](#) in [Nursing Outlook](#). She, and her co-authors, argue that while older adults in many countries share a desire to remain at home at long as possible, a technology gap leaves a mismatch between what older adults want and the current reality of doing this safely and inclusively.

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### Dean travels to Kenya with UC Davis chancellor

Dean Stephen Cavanagh joined a UC Davis and California state delegation to meet with Kenyan leaders to explore expanding collaboration in key strategic areas. For the School of Nursing, the visit deepened its growing relationship with the University of Nairobi's Faculty of Health Sciences. New initiatives will focus on nursing education, healthy aging, digital health, cancer care, and HIV research—building on UC Davis's long-standing presence and programs in Kenya.



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## Betty Irene Moore Fellows gather in the nation's capital

For the first time since its launch, the national program office for the Betty Irene Moore Fellowship for Nurse Leaders and Innovators held its annual convocation in Washington, D.C. The nation's capital served as a fitting backdrop for [the program's sixth event](#), which focused on the intersection of policy, politics and nursing innovation.

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## Faculty present on preceptor shortage at national conference

Vanndy Loth, Lynda Creighton-Wong and Stacey Green presented the study, "Exploring Motivations and Barriers: A Qualitative Study of Precepting Among Current Advanced Practice Nurses in Behavioral Health," at the [Annual American Psychiatric Nurses Association \(APNA\) Educational Conference](#). As faculty in the [UC Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner Certificate Program](#), the team is investigating how to recruit and retain preceptors by looking at motivations and barriers to precepting.

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## Faculty, alumni and postdocs publish caregiver study in national journal

Professors Janice F. Bell and Heather M. Young led a team that published [Comparison of Caregivers of Older Adults in State and National Surveys to Those seeking Help in California's Caregiver Resource Centers](#) in the journal [Gerontologist](#). Researchers found that caregivers who seek help through California's Caregiver Resource Centers differ significantly from those represented in national and state surveys. These findings suggest that relying solely on population-based surveys may overlook the needs of caregivers who most require support and resources.

- **Associate Professor Jessica Draughon Moret** was awarded the 2025 Chancellor's Achievement Award for Diversity and Community. She is one of six recipients honored for making a difference in moving UC Davis toward a more diverse and inclusive campus community.
- Nurse anesthesia **Professor Lee Ranalli** received the 34th Annual Didactic Instructor of the Year Award from the American Association of Nurse Anesthesiology.
- **Associate Professor Laura Van Auken** was recognized for her outstanding global engagement work with the UC Davis Chancellor's Award for International Engagement.
- The **Marketing and Communications Team** won the 2025 PRSA Influencer of the Year Award and received an honorable mention in the highly competitive PR Daily 2025 Content Marketing Awards for our [2024 Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing Annual Magazine](#). The publication highlights a year of impact, inspiring pride among our community while attracting future students, faculty and partners.
